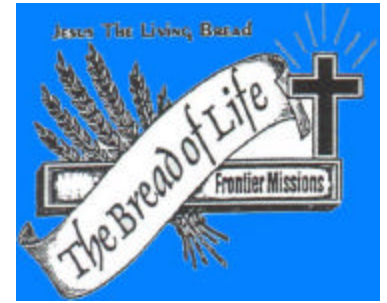

Statement of purpose: BLFM is helping coordinate the U.S./Canada evangelical ministries into Mexico while keeping the spirit of "Visitors coming to assist the national church." *Therefore all ministries are done under the leadership of national personnel who are committed to carry on the ministry as God is leading them.*

BLFM method of ministry is to identify what God is doing in an area and then find willing people and churches that can partner with the national church.

The work of BLFM is: To help outfit national ministries and churches to pass on the Bread of Life: To play a role in fulfilling the Great Commission of our Lord: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

BLFM is a volunteer army. There is no one on salary from BLFM in the U.S. Since Don Albrecht's passing, his vision of nationalizing the ministry has been realized. BLFM is a retired salesman from Waco, Texas driving laborers to work sites in Aztec Country. It is a school teacher from Brownsville, Texas writing thank you notes and receipts to financial supporters of the ministry. It is a chemi-

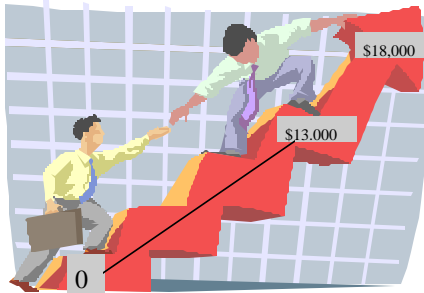


David Nuckols, USA Director of BLFM.

cal engineer from Houston compiling and editing film and notes for distribution. It is tailors, accountants, and medical professionals just like you who have a passion to share the Good News with those who have not yet had an opportunity to hear.

Matamoros Land Fund

We thank God for the outpouring of generosity for the Matamoros Land Fund. Since the last newsletter, \$13,000 has been given. The vision is to relocate the church at Las Palmas and transform it into a multi-purpose facility. While the new facility will continue to serve as a place of worship, the plans is to have larger facilities to minister in a greater way in Matamoros; -To the people living in the "colonias" (neighborhoods thrown together with minimal facilities and little hope); To the families who are forced to sleep on the streets while visiting relatives in jail. To share food and the love of Christ with those who do not now know Him as Lord and Savior. Matamoros is a city of nearly 1,000,000 inhabitants. God has provided a steady stream of talented construction workers in the Winter Texan population. With His help, this new facility will be a great blessing to the community and will facilitate more avenues for service. We hope to acquire the land within the next few months and to break ground in November to coincide with the return of the Winter Texans.
