### Aztec Fall Outreach Go Tell It On The Mountain

Last Wednesday, a group of around 30 representing 4 different countries traveled together in five different vehicles to the village of Tenexco (pronounced Teneshco), Hidalgo. It took us a day and half from the border to arrive in the mountain village. We ascended to over 5,200 feet only to descend to about 1,400 feet to reach Tenexco with 2 doctors, 2 nurses, 3 dentists, 1 pharmacist assistant, 1 ophthalmologist, 1 building crew, 1 scouting crew, 2 local missionaries, 1 praise team and a

number of translators and helpers all came with a single purpose—to share the love of God. We had the privilege of working with Pastor Tomas of the new church plant in Tenexco and seeing the exterior of the church building there completed. While villagers waited in line to be treated, the hills were echoing God's praise as Worship leader, Gil, from the Las Palmas Praise Band led songs. Pastor Juan Roque showed inspirational films each night with a makeshift screen draped over the fence surrounding the local school yard. All in this village who wanted medical attention were served, as well as some of the villagers from nearby Tenango and Santa Martha. The ladies of the church prepared our meals each day and at night we slept at the more than 1,000- star hotel (before the fog rolled in). What a pleasure it was to work with the body of Christ from Canada, U.S., Mexico and Columbia to share his love in this village. Please continue to lift up the seeds planted in the village of Tenexco, that "the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of Glory, may give them a spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him, having the eyes of their hearts enlightened, that they may know what is the HOPE to which he has called them, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of His power in us who believe, according to the working of His great might..."
